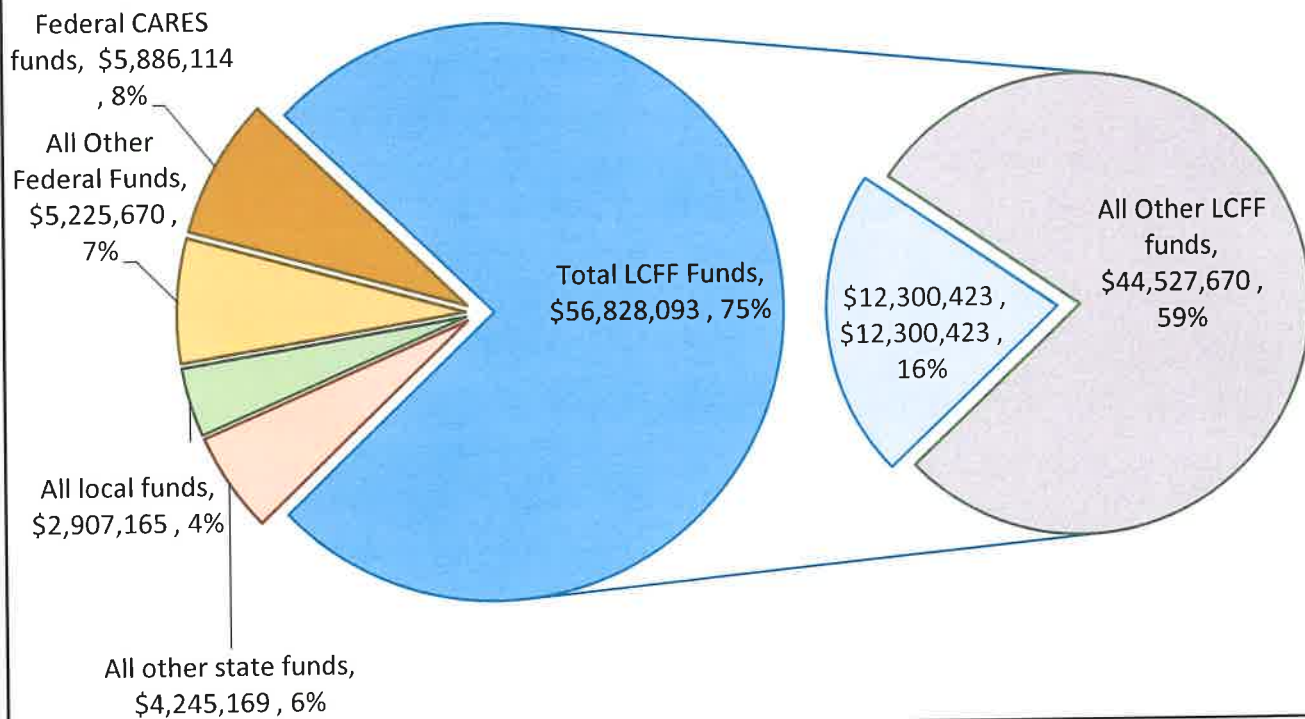

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

### Projected Revenue by Fund Source

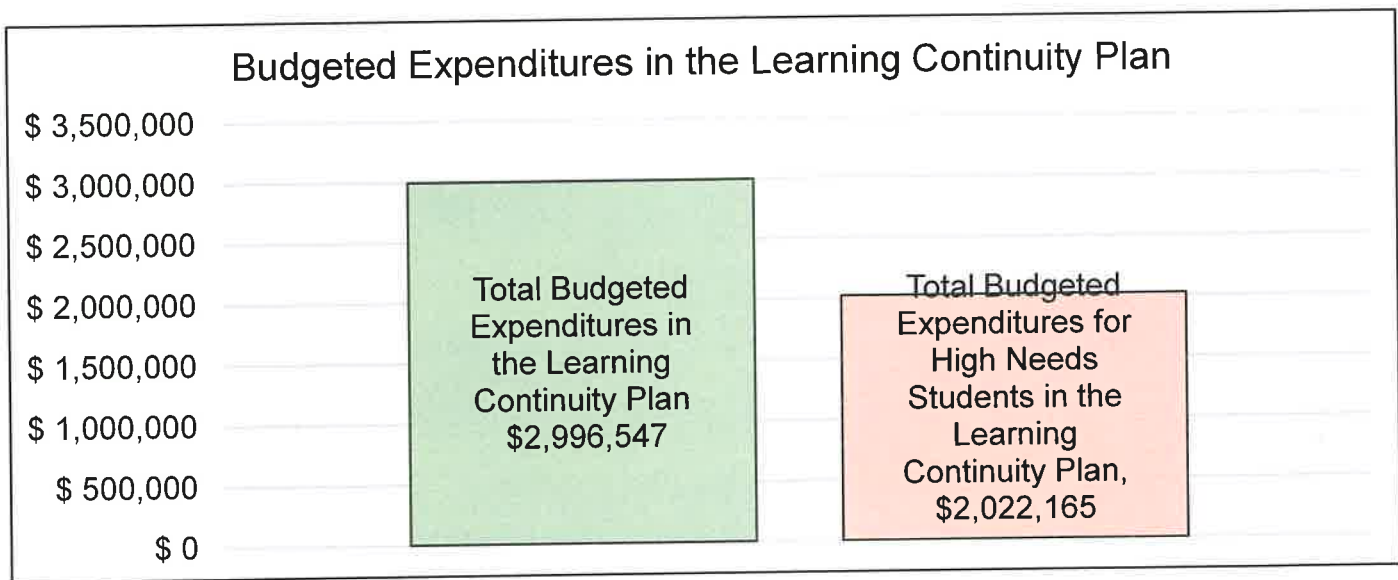


This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Kerman Unified School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

# LCFF Budget Overview for Parents

The total revenue projected for Kerman Unified School District is \$75,092,211.00, of which \$56,828,093.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$4,245,169.00 is other state funds, \$2,907,165.00 is local funds, and \$11,111,784.00 is federal funds. Of the \$11,111,784.00 in federal funds, \$5,886,114.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$56,828,093.00 in LCFF Funds, \$12,300,423.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Kerman Unified School District plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Kerman Unified School District plans to spend \$65,949,281.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$2,996,547.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$62,952,734.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

teacher and classified salaries, supplemental instructional materials, STEM materials, school supplies for the classrooms, facility materials and improvements (not related to COVID-19/PPE materials), technology (not related to COVID-19 needs), and extracurricular supplies.

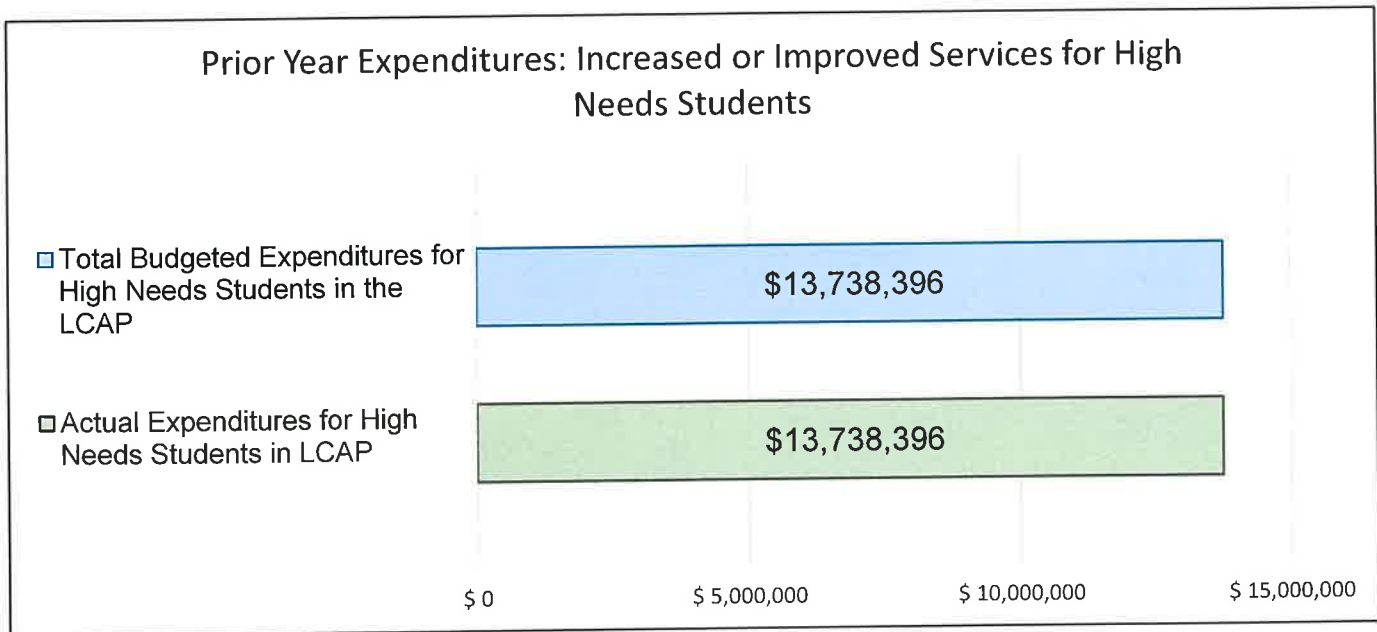
## Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, Kerman Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$12,300,423.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Kerman Unified School District must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. Kerman Unified School District plans to spend \$2,022,165.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

campus liaisons, additional high school counselors, summer school for credit recovery, credit recovery offered during the school year, supplemental instructional materials, instructional tutors, and academic coaches. These actions are included in the 2019-2020 LCAP and are continuing in the 2020-2021 school year.

## Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020
