

# Kerman Unified School District Dual Enrollment Information



Dual enrollment allows high school students to enroll in college coursework. These courses can also count towards a high school diploma, giving students a head start on higher education.



The goal of Kerman Unified School District allowing students to take advantage of dual enrollment is to

- **Increase the number of graduates** with postsecondary degrees in high-growth, high-wage disciplines that will meet the region's economic and labor market needs.
- **Reduce racial and ethnic economic disparities** in degree attainment and the labor market.
- **Improve graduation rates** and shorten the time to completion for associate's and bachelor's degrees.

Dual enrollment leads to many benefits, which include:

- College courses count for high school credit
- FREE OF COST
- Increased high school completion rates
- Higher rates of college enrollment (especially for our traditionally underrepresented subgroups)
- Higher rates of college degree completion
- Shorter average time spent earning a bachelor's degree
